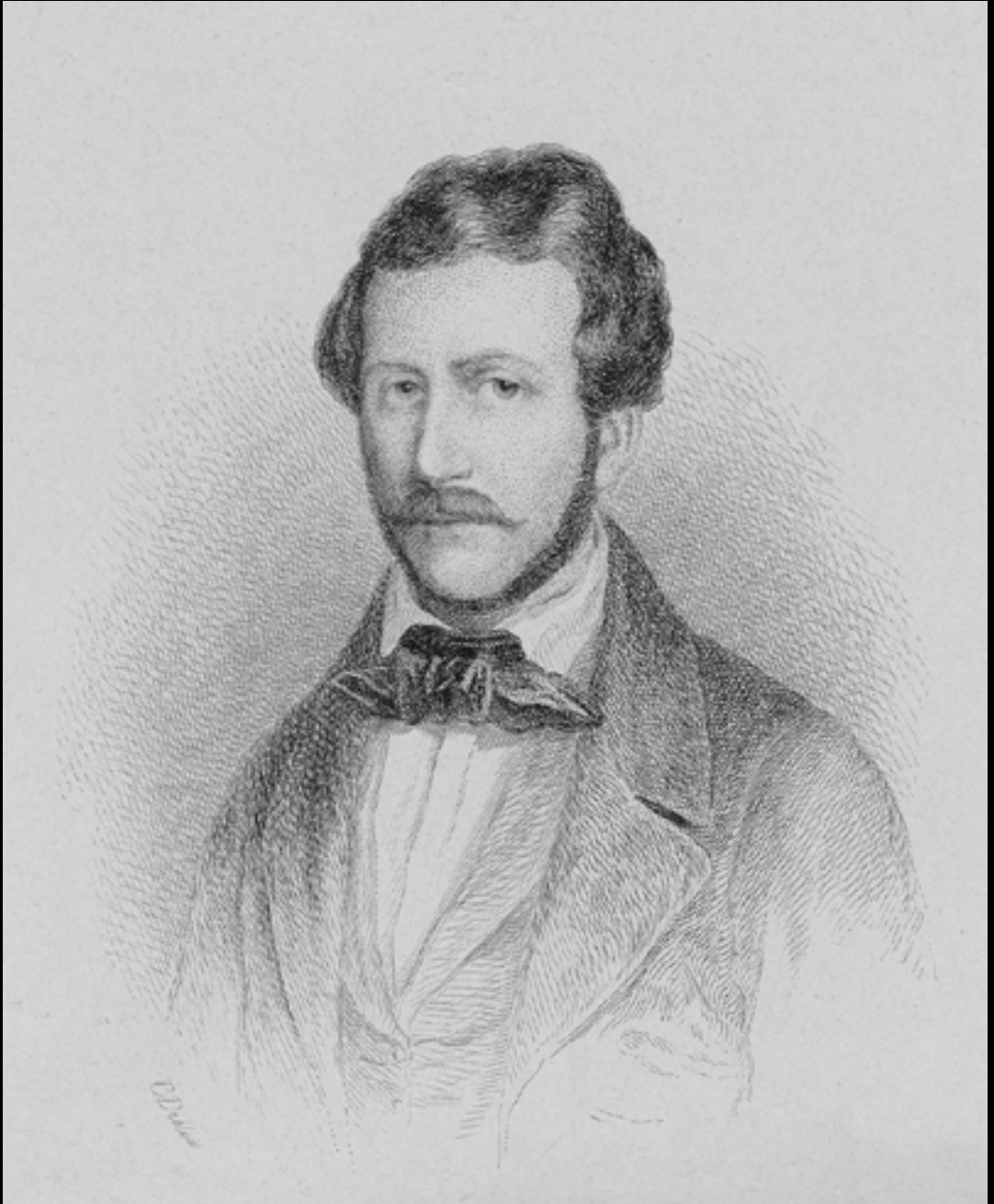

Legend has it that the WHRB Orgy® tradition began over seventy-five years ago, in the spring of 1943. At that time, it is said that one Harvard student, then a staff member of WHRB, returned to the station after a particularly difficult exam and played all of Beethoven's nine symphonies consecutively (from 78 rpm records) to celebrate the end of a long, hard term of studying. The idea caught on, and soon the Orgy® concept was expanded to include live jazz, rock, hip-hop, blues, and even sports Orgies. The Orgy® tradition lives on today at WHRB. During the Reading and Exam Periods of Harvard College, WHRB presents marathon-style musical programs devoted to a single composer, performer, genre, or subject.

3:30 am THE CANTERBURY SCENE ORGY

The small city of Canterbury in Kent, England is perhaps best known for Chaucer's Tales, but over five centuries later, another tale would begin there when five boys founded The Wilde Flowers in 1964. Born amid the fertile musical scene of the British Invasion, The Wilde Flowers would develop a musical style of their own that fused psychedelic rock, jazz, folk, improvisation, and whimsy, which would come to be known as "The Canterbury Sound." Over the next two decades, this band fractured into many different offshoot groups, like The Soft Machine, Caravan, Egg, Gong, and National Health, each evolving the sound in newer directions. Tune in to The Canterbury Scene Orgy for a chronology of the history of the scene and its network of fellow musicians and friends.

Have you ever wondered what a hundred metronomes sounds like? How about a string quartet with two cellos instead of two violins? A concerto for violin and wind ensemble? He invented noise rock and sang about drugs, sex, and drag to an America that had never heard anything like him. He was no "Average Guy!" He was, of course, Lou Reed: come take a "Walk On The Wild Side" and enjoy eight raucous hours of this legendary musician and Factory house band The Velvet Underground, from proto-punk classic *White Light/White Heat* to moody, melodic *VU & Nico* and beyond.

Take a roadtrip with the Blues Department! Climb in as we drive through historic locations like the Mississippi Delta, Chicago, and more. At each stop, we'll look around, listen to the Blues tunes from that locale, and even hear some stories from the Blues artists who made these places hotbeds of Blues music.

When Liz Phair burst onto the indie rock scene with her raucous 1993 album *Exile* in Guyville, the male-dominated underground genre didn't know what had hit it. Phair's frank exploration of female sexuality and young-adult frustration simultaneously raised critics' eyebrows and blazed a trail that female indie rock artists have walked ever since. This orgy will trace Phair's discography, from her rough, bootleg *Girly-Sound* tapes to the more mainstream pop albums that earned her critical scorn and an infamous 0/10 Pitchfork review. Along the way, we'll hear from some of the women who have followed in Phair's footsteps—including many of the other artists who have soundtracked our female DJs through their coming of age.

10:00 pm DISCOGRAPHY OF KENDRICK LAMAR

This orgy will work through the entire discography of generation-defining musician Kendrick Lamar, from 2010's *Overly Dedicated* to 2022's *M. Morale & The Big Steppers*.

Billy Strings is the face of modern bluegrass. From selling out Red Rocks to performing at the Grammys, the 2022 IBMA entertainer of the year is taking the genre to places it has never been. His live shows feature an eclectic mix of traditional bluegrass, soaring electric guitar, and covers of everything from the Grateful Dead to Pearl Jam. This orgy will feature a combination of studio and live recordings, songs ranging from two to twenty minutes in length, and a whole lot of lightning-fast picking from this genre-defining artist.

1:30 am 14 AGAIN

Everyone likes to pretend that they don't remember what life was like at 14, but of course, everyone does: it was rough. This orgy will feature tracks to take you right back to that high-school-freshman, don't-know-who-you-are, scared-of-life-but-also-ready-to-take-on-the-world aura that defines early adolescence.

5:30 am HUGH MASEKELA, THE FATHER OF SOUTH AFRICAN JAZZ

In Johannesburg, South Africa, there is the national anthem, and then there is the music of Hugh Masekela. His 1972 LP was called "Home is Where The Music Is" — nothing could be closer to the truth. Short of boarding the next plane to Johannesburg from Boston Logan, this set will transport you by way of triumphant trumpeting and textured vocals to a country rich in minerals, rich in music, and rich in love. Hugh Masekela's discography begins in the 60s, plays its way out of apartheid, and arrives on the other end both changed and unchanged.

9:30 am CZECH CHAMBER MUSIC

With a focus on the late 19th and early 20th century, this orgy will feature trios, quartets, quintets, sextets, and octets by Czech composers. Tune in for favorites like Dvorak, Janacek, and Smetana, and equally great but less known composers whom you might not be expecting. And stay listening for challenging combinations of brooding yet romantic melodies, asymmetrical rhythms, and folkish yet modern tonalities.

WHRB Classical celebrates the Italian composer most known for his nearly 70 opera compositions Domenico Gaetano Maria Donizetti and his 225th birthday with over 100 hours of opera, symphonies, string quartets, and more. The Donizetti Orgy will run from December 5 to December 18. Tune in to hear a comprehensive exploration of Donizetti's life and legacy and learn about the profound impact the Italian opera composer had on classical music.

Italian film composer Piero Piccioni was born in Italy in 1921. Having grown up listening to jazz music from Charlie Parker and Art Tatum, many of his compositions take influences from jazz and bossa nova. Piccioni composed music for over 300 film soundtracks throughout his career, including *Il bell'Antonio*, *Contempt*, and *Camille 2000*. Tune in for a deep dive into Piccioni's compositions.
